The Town of Gardnerville and its board have set a priority on Emergency Preparedness these past couple of months. The town board attended a training provided on by East Fork Fire as Douglas County Emergency Management Team discussing the effects of flooding within the Carson Valley. This training created an opportunity for the board members to focus on emergency response and inform residents of the potential risks of emergency situations. The Town Board directed staff to provide information to town residents and property owners on how to be prepared for an emergency. With a conversation during the Towns Strategic Plan review in March of this year, the board directed staff to develop a list of contents and information for a 72 hour kit to be used by the residents so they could be more prepared for a disaster. FEMA Emergency Management Institute offers a training course IS-22 "Are You Ready?" if you are interested in learning how to prepare yourself, your family, and your community before a disaster or for the next mother nature event. With the recent flash flooding events in Johnson Lane area it seemed like an appropriate time to get the Gardnerville residents and give you the tools needed to be prepared for that next emergency. The attached flyer includes information and contents for creating a 72 hour kit for your household or business. It is a check list of items suggested to have gathered together in a single location, available for grab and go situations so you don't have to spend time during the emergency event gathering items before leaving your home.

Be Informed. Natural and man-made disasters can strike at any time. Nevada, and in particular Gardnerville, is susceptible to many natural hazards including floods, high wind storms, winter weather and blizzards, thunderstorms, lightning, wildfires and earthquakes. In addition, man-made disasters can also occur including hazardous materials incidents, power outages, transportation accidents, water supply problems, terrorism and others. Douglas County does have a reverse 911 system in place to contact local citizens with emergency notifications. You don't know when the next emergency or disaster will occur or what it will be, so take some time to make a plan for what you and your family will do during an emergency.

Make a Plan: Your family may not all be together when an emergency occurs, so you should have a plan to keep you and your family safe whether you "stay" or "go". While making a plan can sound challenging and formal, it is simple and doesn't even need to be written down. The important thing is that all family members know what to do in different types of emergencies.

Build an Emergency Kit: Everyone should keep certain items around the house and workplace in the event you are isolated for three to five days without power or unable to go to a store. See the attached handout for the town's copy of the suggested items for your kit.

While some items, such as bottled water, food, flashlight, radio and extra batteries, a first aid kit, sanitation items and clothing should be in everyone's kit, it is important to customize the kit for the needs of you and your family. Consider medications, extra eyeglasses, contact lenses, dentures, extra batteries for hearing aids, wheelchairs, or other medical equipment, oxygen tanks, children's items, food & supplies for pets and service animals. Having medical insurance information, medical records, and serial numbers of medical devices will provide additional information during an emergency.

Many people want to get involved in emergency preparedness and response. Disaster preparedness, response, and recovery takes the whole community to be effective. Major disasters can overwhelm first responder agencies, so other organizations are needed to assist in different ways. Get trained and volunteer with a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), Search and Rescue or program offered by the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) unit and/or other Citizen Corps Partner Program or Affiliate organization. Arbor Day



Arbor Day 2016

The Town of Gardnerville celebrated Arbor Day on April 29, 2016 at 3:45 p.m. at Carrick Pond near Wal Mart. Girl Scout Troops 287 and 314 and Boy Scout Packs 8583 and 411 were in attendance. Gardnerville Town Manager Tom Dallaire gave a short presentation to the scouts on planting trees. Eric Roussel, Nevada Department of Forestry, and Geoff LaCost, Gardnerville Maintenance Superintendent were also on hand to help the scouts plant two Skyline Locusts and one Frontier Elm. After the festivities each participant was given a Ponderosa Pine tree to plant at home. Town of Gardnerville celebrated being named Tree City USA for and also received the growth award for 2015 by the Arbor Day Foundation. The town earned the growth award through our recycling program and the tree inventory & analysis that was performed. This is the 14th year Gardnerville has earned the national designation of Tree City USA and the sixth year we have received the growth award.

Town Projects Update

Precision Concrete has repaired over 330 trip hazards in Gardnerville. These repairs improve safety while walking along the sidewalks reducing the number of issues on town streets.

A storm drain was replaced on Hussman near Jessica improving drain-



age from the street into the Cottonwood Slough. Ponding has been an issue in the past for this area. We strive to reduce flooding potential in Gardnerville.

The Martin Slough and open space behind "The Ranch" was cleaned up and mowed along the open space. As part of a regular maintenance program this will keep the willows in check and the water flowing through our great valley.

Improvement plans have been submitted for the Trinity Lutheran Church Parking lot at the corner

of Mill and Douglas. The Town is partnering on the project to improve street lights, drainage, sidewalks, curb and gutter in that area. This will improve the accessibility to the space and is part of Safe Routes to School.

ADA Ramp Replacements

Four ramps on the corner of Toler and US Highway 395 were replaced by Impact Construction in an effort to improve the Town ADA compliance. This is a part of the Safe Routes to School for children attending Gardnerville Elementary School.

Chichester Crack Repair

Over 60 cracks in Chichester are scheduled for repair with some in excess of 10" in width. The project will be completed this summer. This failure of the as-

phalt is widespread through Chichester and we are addressing the issue one street at a time. Total replacement is not a viable option because of the expense. Thank you for your patience.



Waterloo/North Hampton Street Light

We are scheduling a light to be installed on this corner. This will improve pedestrian visibility in the area as they cross North Hampton.

Street Light Prototypes

We have installed two new night sky compliant street lights in town as a possible change to the Town standards. One is located at the end of Snafflebit Dr. and the other is in the middle of Gilman Ave. just past Chichester Drive. Let us know if you like them as they appear to reduce light pollution.

The Hellwinkel Channel and Pedestrian path has been completed creating a critical link from the Martin Slough Nature Trail to Toler Lane exiting near Gardnerville Elementary School (GES). The path improves the Safe Routes to School for the children going to GES and promotes the town's vision of "...walk-able, safe town, well connected with accessible trails for walking, running and cycling". The channel is designed to improve flood drainage in the



area providing an avenue to transport flood waters to the Gilman Ponds and Martin Slough. The channel was seeded last fall and with the spring rains the grass has filled in nicely. Overhead power was relocated underground and power poles removed from the sidewalks near GES. This was a major project for the town and we are happy to have this improvement completed. We would like to thank our citizens for your patience while we completed this long term project.

Trees for Shade

Homeowners can make significant cash savings by properly using trees for shade. How much is saved depends on climate, existing tree cover and type of building. The savings can be anywhere from 10% to 65%. But even 10% is no small matter in most family budgets. Maximum benefit from shade usually comes from trees planted on the east and west sides. Prioritize areas of greatest heat gain or importance for comfort. Shading asphalt shingles is more essential than shading cedar shakes. Provide shade for driveways and parking areas. If possible, shade your air conditioning unit. Consider shading patios and porches. When planning where to plant trees, remember that the sun's position in the sky changes hourly and daily. Plan for shadows that cover targeted areas during the hottest hours of summer. Plan tree locations by observing summer shadows on your property.

Highlights of Main Street Gardnerville Accomplishments

Organization Committee

1. Program voted "Best Non-Profit in Carson Valley" and one of our volunteers, Carol Sandmeier, voted "Best Volunteer in Carson Valley" through the Record Courier's annual "Best of" promotion.

2. Presentation made during the 2015 Legislature requesting the creation of a statewide Main Street Program. It was not approved but we will be submitting it again in the next legislative session.

3. Received the "Tour Around Nevada" award.

Promotion Committee

1. Secured the Great Race, in partnership with the Town of Gardnerville. Along with the Great Race lunch stop we are hosting a classic car show. The event will be held June 19, 2016.

2. Held our inaugural Slaughterhouse Lane Coffin Races in October. This event proved to be a success. It will now become an annual event.

3. Partnered with East Fork Gallery on their annual Scarecrow Festival to take place with the Heritage Park Gardens Fall Festival event.
