Manager's Message"

The past 6 months have been hectic for staff with the Great Race coming to town, (Gardnerville won the "Best Lunch Stop" award, providing movies in the park, planning and coordinating with NV Energy on several projects that are in the works. Town staff put on a tree trimming class at Stodick Estates, and we implemented a new work order system that is working very well. We know we need to focus on more road maintenance. We will be doing what we can over the winter with larger project coming this spring. The town sanitation department is streamlining routes and disposal of the refuse. We need your help with what goes into the totes. The blue tote is for all your household trash. The green tote (or if you still have a blue tote with a reflector) is for green waste which is for grass, shrubs and tree trimmings that need to fit into the bin with the lid closed. Oversized or excessive amounts of leaves can be dropped off at the town maintenance facility next to Raley's.

As of October 1, the Town of Gardnerville Health & Sanitation Division has had the ability to accept automatic payments which many customers requested. Call the town office if you would like to set up your account for Autopay or see and pay your account online. The first time you access your account online you will need to call the town office for your password.

Convenience fees for electronic transactions started on October 1, 2016. We have changed credit card providers so electronic payment fees could be reduced. The charges for use of electronic payments if you are paying your account with a debit card is $.28\% + .25\phi$; e-check (ACH) is .75%; and credit cards are $2.19\% + .19\phi$.

We have an opportunity to participate in a pilot recycling program with Douglas Disposal from February through July 2017. The Ranch at Gardnerville and a few streets in Chichester closest to the Ranch (Kimbles, Grendon, Campbell, Longfellow, Edlesborough and Hanslope) have been chosen for the test area. The residents in these areas will be sent a letter with more details. We will be delivering cans with yellow lids to these areas. This will give us information we will need in determining if a door-to-door recyling program is feasible.

PLEASE do not put trash in your greenwaste cans. Trash in the greenwaste is becoming problematic. If there is trash in your greenwaste can more than once the can will be confiscated.

Town Projects



The Dube` Group is wrapping up the Gardnerville Station building plans. We are planning on submitting to the county for a building permit in January. Bramco will be back onsite in December to clean out the rest of the contamination from the site and remove the existing canopy. The town was not successful in getting funding from Community Development Block Grant and staff will re-apply one more time showing a larger impact to the economic development that the Governor's Office of Economic Development is looking for in these applications.

How to Plant a Windbreak

The Cooperative Extension Service, U.S. Natural Resources Conservation Service and your state forest service have localized literature to help with design and selection of the best species for effective windbreaks. Some general guideslines are:

Species

Conifers form the best windbreaks, depending on local conditions. Some of the faster-growing favorites are pines, such as Austrian, Ponderosa, Scots,. Douglas Fir, true firs, red cedar and junipers are also used. Spruces are excellent, but usually grow slowly. Arrangement

Two or more rows of trees are best if space allows, but even a single row will have an effect. Plant the rows perpendicular to prevailing winter winds. Trees should be spaced closely 8" to 12" on center, or even as close as 4" to 6" with arborvitae and 12' between rows. When planting two or more rows, stagger the trees for maximum effect.





Staff has been working on the improvement plans for the Martin Slough Nature Trail path to extend the walking path around the existing ponds with a new crosswalk at the culvert crossing and provide a direct path for the school kids to access Carson Valley Middle School.

The town is working on plans for construction later this year for the town maintenance yard to improve the greenwaste drop off area and block the view of the town yard from the traffic on Hwy 395.



Staff was successful in receiving the approval from the Army Corps of Engineer for the proposed improvements needed along Hwy 395 at Kingslane. The project includes 100 feet of new sidewalk, a drainage channel improvement, including Kingslane entrance improvements, replacing existing deteriorating CMP pipe under Kingslane.

The past couple months, Colbre Paving was working on the Trinity Lutheran parking lot. The town worked with the church and the county to perform some much needed drainage improvements on Mill Street and worked with the homeowners at Mill and Douglas to provid improved drainage and ADA access at the intersection. The rest of Mill Street will be upgraded when the crosswalks go in at Hwy 395 and Mill Street.

Hwy 395 Crosswalk Project was reviewed by the State Historic Preservation Office. A more detailed report was required. We submitted a new report and are awaiting the result. The Nevada Department of Transportation is working with the adjacent property owners to acquire the needed right-of-way for the proposed improvements at the three intersections.

We are creating a new website set to launch this coming spring. If you have any ideas on what you would like to see on the town website and/or any projects you see a need within the town, please let one of the town staff know or send your idea in an email to the Town Manager.


May 17 or 18 Limb Pickup

Battle Born - Main Street



For 35 years, Main Streets across the country have been doing important work, dedicating themselves to improving the quality of life in their communities and preserving the unique heritage of their downtowns and commercial districts. While the Main Street movement is recognized in many circles as an important player in downtown revitalization, collectively, we see an opportunity to raise the profile of the work we do and the impact we have.

Main Street Gardnerville (MSG) is the longest running Main Street program in Nevada. We are in our 8th year thanks to the support of the Town and the Community. With the exception of one paid staff member, we are an all-volunteer organization of approximately

130 individuals who give their time and talents to various projects and events for the purpose of revitalizing our downtown district.

In keeping with our mission, the MSG Program takes great pride in our community and strives to make it a place where both locals and tourists want to come and spend time.

Since our inception in late 2008, our volunteers have logged over 31,000 hours working on projects such as Heritage Park Gardens; Flower Baskets & Adopt-a-Pots; Sidewalk Gallery; 2% Revolving Loan Fund; Community Clean Up Days as well as a variety of different events including "Thirsty Third Thursday Wine Walks", "Freedom 5K Fun Run/Walk", "Harvest Festival" and the "Slaughterhouse Lane Coffin Races".

Speaking of the coffin races, our 2nd Annual "Slaughterhouse Lane Coffin Races" event was well attended by both participants and spectators. We crowned a new winner, "Black Betty" from Stor-All and the CV 20/30 Club. The DCSO "Coffin Crusaders" received the People's Choice Award. Nearly 400 folks filled Heritage Park for this family-friendly event, held on October 8th. People are already making plans for their entries for our next one so mark your calendar for October 14th, 2017!

MSG is a community based self-help program involving various members of the community with the shared vision of revitalizing the downtown. Even though

we focus on the downtown district, it benefits the entire community. We have been meeting with representatives from other rural areas to discuss the possible creation of more Main Street programs within our state. Our sister town, Minden, is currently in their 2nd year as a Main Street program. Our goal is to eventually get a state program in place.

Our MSG program is succeeding thanks to the financial support and volunteer efforts of the residential and business community.
